New Zero-Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Funding Opportunity for Municipalities

The Government of Canada is requesting project proposals for electric vehicle charging stations in public areas and on-street.

The Government of Canada has introduced the **Zero-Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program** (ZEVIP) to address the lack of charging and refuelling stations in Canada. ZEVIP will provide funding to increase the availability of charging and zero-emission refuelling opportunities where Canadians live and work. Municipalities are encouraged to apply for funding to set up charging stations in public places and on-street / curbside locations. Future ZEVIP initiatives will include charging stations at workplaces and multi-unit residential buildings, as well as zero-emission commercial vehicle fleets and public transportation projects.

Natural Resources Canada strongly recommends that applicants familiarize themselves with the **Applicants Guide** before completing the application package. The Applicants Guide goes into further detail about eligible projects, timeframes and the application process.

A completed **application package** [Word file] consists of:

- a completed application form;
- supporting documentation; and
- a signed attestation.

Applicants are required to submit a single copy of the application package by **23:59 Eastern Daylight Time, September 18, 2019** by email at NRCan.TAF-TCR.RNCan@Canada.ca or by **mail**.
