RMH is seeking applications for its second year of operation.

The **Rural Mental Health Project** (RMH), hosted by the **Alberta Division of the Canadian Mental Health Association**, is a program that works with rural communities to develop community mental health roadmaps and action plans. The RMH works to train local Community Animators, who will then act as leaders in their community to bring together stakeholders, including municipalities, and develop a mental health roadmap.
