Complimentary Shuttle Bus

There will be complimentary ETS shuttle buses running between RMA's [preferred convention hotels](#) and the Edmonton EXPO Centre during peak times. A shuttle bus schedule and map is available on the app, in the delegate handbook and will be posted in the foyer of all preferred hotels. Watch for the RMA Convention ETS Shuttles at ETS stops located outside the preferred hotels and they will take you right to the EXPO door. Masks must be worn on the shuttle buses.

COVID-19 Protocols: Have You Gotten Your QR Code Yet?

The Edmonton EXPO Centre is participating in the Government of Alberta's [Restriction Exemption Program](#).

- ◆ To enter the facility, proof of vaccination is required in the form of the QR code available at alberta.ca/covidrecords. **The QR code is the only proof of vaccination accepted after November 15, 2021.** Albertans can download, screenshot, or print it. If you do not have access to cell phones or computers, you can get a printed QR code at any registry.
- ◆ On-site testing during the event is available for those who have not yet been vaccinated. The cost of the testing is \$30 and will be the responsibility of the attendee to pay. Only credit cards will be accepted, we are unable to invoice member municipalities for this service.
- ◆ Once inside the facility, face masks are required unless eating or drinking in designated areas. The Government of Alberta does not consider face shields to be an acceptable alternative to a mask and may not be worn on their own. A face mask must cover a person's nose, mouth, and chin. You may remove your masks only when eating or drinking in designated areas.
