Registration Open for EOEP's Virtual Service Delivery Course

The course builds on foundations learned in Munis 101

The Elected Officials Education Program (EOEP) is excited to announce a virtual offering of *Council's Role in Service Delivery*. Understanding setting service levels is fundamental to the job of an elected official. Municipal councils are expected to plan, govern, and set policy for the best interests of their community. Understanding the various aspects of service delivery is central to the role of elected officials.

Municipalities are about delivering the services that support safe, healthy, and prosperous communities, and council's role in this process is to decide what services are needed, what level they need to be delivered at, and what methods of delivery best fit the needs of the community. The *Council's Role in Service Delivery* course will provide an overview of the various services and delivery mechanisms available to municipalities, the pros, and cons of each, and how councils can make educated decisions related to service delivery.
