2023 Resolution Status Update - Volume 1 Now Available

The Resolution Status Update provides up-to-date information and progress updates for all active resolutions

The RMA is pleased to provide members with an update on advocacy efforts through the [2023 Resolution Status Update - Volume 1](#). This document, previously known as the “Advocacy Report Card,” has been re-titled to better reflect its intent: to provide an update on government responses and actions on RMA resolutions. The Resolution Status Update is an important part of the RMA’s efforts to be transparent and accountable to members, as it provides an update on the status of all active resolutions.

Section 1 of the Resolution Status Update includes the Government of Alberta’s responses to resolutions endorsed at the 2022 Fall Convention. Section 2 provides an update on all other active resolutions.

Following each review, the status may change depending on any developments that have occurred. Further, after resolutions expire, regardless of their status, the RMA continues to reference them when related issues arise.

Resolutions form an integral part of the RMA’s advocacy efforts. The RMA would like to acknowledge the work that the membership undertakes in drafting and debating resolutions that reflect issues of importance to rural municipalities. Endorsed resolutions provide direction for the RMA and enable focused advocacy efforts.

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
