Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR)

Shifts the physical and financial burden of collecting, sorting, processing, and recycling waste to the producer and away from local governments and taxpayers.

Alberta's new EPR framework will diversify our economy by encouraging companies to find innovative ways to recycle more materials and produce less packaging waste.

EPR in Alberta

- EPR ensures producers' responsibility for a product is extended to the post-consumer stage of a product's life cycle
- In 2009, the Canadian Council of Ministers of the Environment (CCME) approved a Canada-wide Action Plan for EPR
- Alberta's new EPR Regulation came into effect November 30, 2022
- EPR supports a circular economy in Alberta which is a key pathway for growth



EPR Policy Intent

- Establish consistent recycling services for Albertans
- Maintain or improve access to recycling services
- Shift the entire financial and operational responsibility of collecting, sorting, processing, and recycling designated materials to the producers of those materials
- Increase diversion and recycling, creating economic opportunities to drive towards a more circular economy



EPR Framework

EPR Regulation Sets the minimum outcomes government wants producers to achieve

Agreement on Oversight and Administration Provides government's expectations for the Alberta Recycling Management Authority (ARMA)

ARMA Bylaws

 Provides details that operationalize regulatory requirements



 Supports bylaws for fee setting, risk-based compliance, etc.


The EPR Team

Our EPR Approach

ARMA is the administration and oversight authority for EPR. Working with all partners, we will establish an efficient and effective EPR system.

*EPR will not affect other Stewardship programs other than the current HHW program.

Made-in-Alberta

Approach that works for our provincial landscape, inspired by what's working in other jurisdictions.



Integrated System

Creating a system that works for all stakeholders including producers, producer responsibility organizations, processing facilities and communities.

Minimize Red-tape

Our goal is to reduce unnecessary processes and red-tape.

Contract between the GoA and ARMA that empowers ARMA to carry out the regulation.

Details on how the regulation will be operated and managed.



Policies & Procedures (ARMA)


Rules and guidelines on specific aspects of operations and how they should be conducted.



Role of Government vs. Oversight

Ministry (AEPA)

- Determine goals, outcomes and direction
- Maintain legislative EPR framework (Act, Regulation) and broad policy direction
- Oversee performance of ARMA in its oversight mandate
- Consult/engage with ARMA as necessary
- Enforce contraventions against the Act or Regulation



Oversight Authority (ARMA)

- Develop and maintain bylaws and policies
- Implement policies and procedures to deliver a level playing field and ensure compliance
- Develop and maintain a registry system
- Engage with stakeholders
- Design measures to monitor and assess performance
- Establish processes and escalation measures to compel compliance, referring to Ministry for enforcement being a last resort
- Report on system health against outcomes set in regulation and keep the Ministry informed of issues



Key Implementation Outcomes



Provincial Recycling Program (PPP)

Recyclable collection will be available to single and multi-family homes across communities in Alberta. For those communities with existing programs, the burden will be shifted to producers and costs will be alleviated from taxpayers.






Provincial Depots (PPP & HSP)

Recycling Depots and/or Collection Events will be available to all communities who participating in the EPR program.





EPR Framework Enactment

EPR regulation came into force in November 2022. ARMA is the Delegated Administrative Organization (DAO) for the EPR regulation.

Since Fall 2022, EPA and ARMA formed a working group to collaborate on transition related work including:

- Transition Working Group Terms of Reference
- Agreement on Oversight and Administration
- Bylaw development and external consultation support

At the same time, ARMA was aligning operations by standing up various functions to support the implementation of EPR. Key activities include the development of the registry, securing of resources, policy development, communications planning and other operational functions.

1st Iteration of Bylaws & Policies Created

Working with the Government of Alberta, as well as conversations from various stakeholders, the first iteration of the Bylaws and Policies will be approved. Additional feedback is expected, both Policies and Bylaws will be revised. The bylaws (one for PPP and another for HSP) will guide the implementation of the EPR framework.









Deadline for Collection & Management Plans

Producers need to submit their collection & management plans by April 2024 (PPP). Due to the tight timelines for implementation, the initial plans are expected to be high level workplans with more details to be confirmed later.









EPR System Operational

April 1, 2025 is the target for an operational EPR system. Communities who have registered for phase 1 of the implementation are expected to have collection services under EPR commence on this date.

Producers

Brand Holder

Holder of the designated material and reside within Canada.

Importer

If there is no brand holder, then the importer would be the producer, if they reside within Alberta.

Retailer

If there is no brand holder or importer, then the retailer is considered the producer.





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Producer Responsibility Organizations (PROs)

An organization appointed by a producer to act as an agent on behalf of the producers. A PRO must be not-for-profit and **cannot** be affiliated with an entity or individual that provides recycling services or waste management services for designated materials.

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Community

A city, town, village, summer village, municipal district, specialized municipality or improvement district within the meaning of the Municipal Government Act, a special area within the meaning of the Special Areas Act, a settlement as defined in the Metis Settlements Act or an Indian reserve as defined in the Municipal Government Act

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Processing Facility

Facilities that receive designated materials for recycling, downcycling, treatment or disposal, or is an exporter of designated materials outside of Alberta.

*Processing facilities cannot be affiliated with PROs.

The Community EPR Journey



Pre-registration

Starting October 2, communities can pre-register on ARMA Connect to express interest in the EPR system.



Registration (

Between Oct 1 –
Dec 31,
communities can
register for Phase 1
of the EPR program.



Discussion

Once a community has registered, they can expect PRO(s) to reach out and discuss the expectations and needs of the community.



Operations


Residents will start receiving recycling collection in April 2025 for Phase I, and October 2026 for Phase II.



Community Registration (Phase I)

Phase I of the EPR system includes communities that register by December 31, 2023 and have existing recycling service as of November 30, 2022.




Community Registration (Phase II)

Phase II of the EPR system includes communities that register after December 31, 2023 even though they had existing recycling collection services as at November 30, 2022.

AND

Communities that <u>did not</u> have recycling collection services as of November 30, 2022.







Community Benefits

No Existing Service

- Bring recycling service to your community at no cost to your municipality.
- Divert material from your waste stream, reducing processing costs.



Existing Recycling Service

Transfer the cost of recycling to producers and reduce the burden on municipalities.

- Circular Materials is the producer responsibility
 organization that will be supporting producers in meetings
 their EPR packaging and paper obligations under the
 regulation including:
 - Collaborating with producers & communities to create detailed collection and management plans in accordance with the Bylaws.
 - Delivering collection services, post-collection services, and promotion and education.
 - Achieving performance standards and reducing overall contamination.



Alberta EPR Timeline



ARMA Bylaws, policies in place.

Registration process open for communities on Oct 2.

Registration process open for producers on Oct 16.

Circular Materials begins consultations for collection and management plans.

Circular Materials directly engages with municipalities transitioning in 2025 to support operations, promotion & education planning.

On behalf of its producers, Circular Materials submits verification of collection and management plans to ARMA April 1, 2025 - EPR Implementation Phase 1:

EPR systems for PPP operational for registered communities with existing services as of Nov 30, 2022.

Oct 1, 2026 - EPR Implementation Phase 2:

EPR systems for PPP operational for registered communities which did not have existing services as of Nov 30, 2022.

Verification of Collection & Management Plans

On behalf of its registered producers, Circular Materials will submit verification to ARMA on April 1, 2025.

Verification plans demonstrate that the producer has agreements or a workplan in place to meet its obligations to collect and manage PPP Designated Materials under Part 1 of the EPR Regulation.



Verification Plan Requirements

As per the Bylaws, when a PPP Producer uses a common collection system, their verification must include the following information:

- confirmation that Registered Communities are to be serviced through the common collection system;
- a description of how PPP Designated Material will be collected in the common collection system;
- a description of how the common collection system will adhere to the common collection system standards;
- a description of how collected material will be processed to meet the material management requirements identified in section 19 of the EPR Regulation;
- evidence the PPP Producer has agreements, or a workplan with key milestones to establish agreements, to fulfill its obligations under Part 1 of the EPR Regulation, including, but not limited to:
 - its undertakings and commitments identified in subsection (a) through (c);
 - agreements with service providers to collect PPP Designated Material from residents with household collection;
 - agreements with service providers to collect PPP Designated Material from residents with depot collection;
 - agreements with Registered Processing Facilities to manage collected material;
 - a plan for promotion and education which includes consideration of the appropriate method for providing promotion and education material to residential dwellings to be serviced under the common collection standards.
