Rural Charitable Gaming Community Guide



For many years, the distribution of charitable gaming funds to voluntary organizations has been unfair to rural communities. Rural voluntary organizations work harder for less funding than their urban counterparts for no reason other than the amount of revenue generated by various casinos across the province. Despite many years of advocacy from RMA and other rural stakeholders, the Government of Alberta has not acted to ensure gaming funds are equitably distributed to charitable organizations across the province. That is why RMA has launched "Losing Bet," a campaign that calls on the Government of Alberta to make changes to the charitable gaming model with the stated intent of providing equitable funding to all participating organizations, regardless of where in the province they are located. The campaign includes many resources that will help members better understand the disparities of the charitable gaming model and an updated Charitable Gaming Report with a series of recommendations on how to close the urban-rural gap.

To ensure the success of this campaign, it will be beneficial for RMA members to share this guide with organizations in their community that utilize charitable gaming to raise funds. From there, organizations can use these questions as a guide to write letters to Service Alberta and Red Tape Reduction and the AGLC to encourage a thoughtful review of the charitable gaming model and proceed with necessary changes to make it more equitable for all.

- What groups/people does your organization serve?
- How much does it cost to run your organization?

To better understand how charitable gaming supports your organization's mission, it will be beneficial to learn more about the work your organization does and the impact it has on the community. This context will help show how charitable gaming revenue helps further your efforts.

Understanding the impact of these funds on your organization will help us better assess the overall effectiveness and sustainability of charitable gaming as a revenue stream.

- How many charitable gaming licenses does your organization have

- How have the inequities of the rural/urban charitable gaming model affected your organization?
- What changes could be made to the system to make it more equitable for all organizations?
- How long does your organization have to wait to host a charitable gaming event?
- How have travel expenses for volunteers impacted your ability to benefit from charitable gaming events?
